PURSUANT to Sections 17 to 20, and Section 64, of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, SDSS Limited (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at 61 Vogel Street Woodville 4920, and known as Super Liquor Woodville, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample for consumption on the premises.

If this licence is not endorsed under Section 40 of the Act, the licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

Conditions

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
- No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Easter Sunday unless the alcohol is grape wine or fruit or vegetable wine made:

- The whole (or each of the following parts) of the premises is designated as a supervised area: Bottlestore 4
- The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the consumption of minors and intoxicated persons are observed and signage is displayed.
- The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible sale of 6. alcohol.
- A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance/s to the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principal entrance
- At each principal entrance to the premises a sign must be displayed stating the hours of business during which the premises are open for the 8. consumption of alcohol
- At each principal entrance to the premises a sign must be displayed stating the Duty Manager. 9.

The Licensed Premises

The premises situated at 61 Vogel Street Woodville 4920 are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped by the Tararua District Licensing Committee on 21/12/2020. The entrance from 61-65 Vogel Street Woodville is designated as the principal entrance.

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licenses, this licence continues in force:

- Either: (a)
 - until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but (ii)
- If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either: (b)
 - until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

DECISION

Authority

The functions, powers and duties as the District Licensing Committee is delegated to the committee chairperson where no objection has been filed, and no matters of opposition have been raised by the Police, Medical Officer of Health, and Inspector, in respect of the following applications:

- an application for a licence;
- an application for a manager's certificate;
- an application for renewal of a licence or manager's certificate.

Statutory Provisions

Summary of Evidence
